- NC has had a total 1,237,393 confirmed cases, with 14,708 deaths. Our state currently has 109,762 active cases and 3,651 hospitalizations.
 - o Beaufort County has had a total of 5,724 cases, with 536 currently active, 13 of which is hospitalized.
 - All active cases are self-isolating.

3rd Dose vs Booster Shot

The Health Department would like to clarify the difference between the additional dose recommendation and the booster recommendation. Though both refer to a 3rd dose, there is a distinction.

On August 13, 2021, the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) made an interim recommendation for the use of an additional dose of Pfizer and Moderna vaccine beyond the initial 2-dose mRNA vaccine series. This additional dose is for those who are moderately to severely immunocompromised.

This interim recommendation for the use of an additional dose came from the ACIP after studies indicated that some immunocompromised people have a reduced immune response following the primary COVID-19 vaccine series when compared to those who are not immunocompromised. The CDC recommends that individuals with the following receive this 3rd dose:

- Been receiving active cancer treatment for tumors or cancers of the blood.
- Received an organ transplant and are taking medicine to suppress the immune system.
- Received a stem cell transplant within the last 2 years or are taking medicine to suppress the immune system.
- Moderate or severe primary immunodeficiency (such as DiGeorge syndrome, WiskottAldrich syndrome)
- Advanced or untreated HIV infection.
- Active treatment with high-dose corticosteroids or other drugs that may suppress your immune response.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) also recommends talking to your healthcare provider about your medical condition, and whether getting an additional dose is appropriate for you.







BCHD will start offering this additional dose on August 25th . Appointments can be made online through the Health Department website booking system or by calling Beaufort County's COVID19 call center at 252-940-6150. Most doctor offices will also be able to administer this additional dose as well.

In contrast to the 3rd dose recommendation above, a booster is given when there is evidence that shows a decrease in the protection against a virus over time. Studies by both Pfizer and Moderna have found a reduction in protection does exist following the completion of their vaccine series and are currently seeking approval for booster shots. Johnson & Johnson continues to evaluate the effectiveness of their shot over time.

Booster shots will be subject to an independent evaluation by the FDA to determine its safety and effectiveness. The CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) will then complete a thorough review of the FDA's findings and make recommendations on the use of boosters for the public. While this process is anticipated to be completed this fall, no date has been set yet. Beaufort County's Health Department is underway with planning efforts to ensure that booster shots can be administered as soon as the evaluation process is completed, and booster vaccines are received.

Vaccine Eligibility

NCDHHS has announced that individuals age 12 and up are now eligible to receive the vaccine. However, Pfizer is currently the only vaccine approved for this age group. Most of Beaufort County's Providers have Moderna and Johnson & Johnson, both of which are only approved for individuals 18 years of age and older.

Pfizer vaccines are available at participating Walgreen Pharmacies as well as Vidant's Greenville Vaccine Clinic. (Please see above the contact information for these locations.)

Beaufort County's Vaccine Efforts

As of Friday (9/3), approximately 44,849 total doses of the COVID-19 vaccine have been administered to Beaufort County residents. 23,482 of our county's residents have received their first dose and 21,367 residents have completed the two shot series.

Beaufort County providers remain committed in our efforts to vaccinate all those who are interested in the COVID-19 vaccine as quickly and efficiently as possible. Please continue to
