

Wednesday Storm Brings Multiple Hazards



OVERVIEW

Strengthening low pressure will bring the potential for several weather hazards as it crosses the area Wednesday and Wednesday night.



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TIMING

- The main severe weather threat will exist Wednesday afternoon through early evening.
- Gusty winds and periods of heavy rainfall expected Wednesday through late Wednesday night.
- Primary coastal flooding threat will be with the Wednesday morning high tide.

HAZARDS & IMPACTS

- **Damaging wind gusts** and **isolated tornadoes** are possible in the strongest storms mainly along and east of US Hwy 17.
- **Gusty winds** outside of stronger storms could blow around light/unsecured objects and bring a couple isolated power outages mainly along the coast.
- **Heavy rainfall** at times could bring minor flooding of low lying and poor drainage areas, making travel hazardous.
- **Coastal flooding** is expected, with minor inundation of very low lying areas mainly focused near inlets and along barrier islands.
- **Strong winds and rough seas** across the coastal waters will produce conditions which are dangerous to all mariners.
