

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# Tropical Storm WARNING

### **Tropical Storm Arthur**





- An enhanced risk for dangerous rip currents will continue into through Monday.
- Tropical storm force winds will be possible along the coast and particularly the Outer Banks.
- Minor storm surge impacts will be possible for areas adjacent to the ocean, sounds, and rivers.

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
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# Tropical Storm WARNING



# High Risk For Rip Currents

### **Tropical Storm Arthur**

### RIPCURRENTS **KNOW YOUR OPTIONS**

#### IF CAUGHT IN A RIP CURRENT

- Relax, rip currents don't pull you under.
- Don't swim against the current.
- Swim out of the current, then to shore.
- If you can't escape, float or tread water.
- If you need help, yell or wave for assistance.

Rip currents are powerful currents of water moving away from shore. They can sweep even the strongest swimmer away from shore. If at all possible, swim near a lifeguard.

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

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
There is a potential for:

- Some damage to roofing and siding materials, along with damage to porches, awnings, carports, and sheds.
- Several large trees snapped or uprooted, but with greater numbers in places where trees are shallow rooted.

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The threat for tropical storm force winds is increasing, especially along the Outer Banks.

Tropical Storm conditions could begin as early as sometime tonight.








# 50kt Wind Speed Probabilities

#### **Tropical Storm Arthur**



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
### The threat for 50 knot winds is increasing, especially over the coastal waters.





## Earliest Reasonable Time of Arrival

### **Tropical Storm Arthur**



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


- The earliest reasonable time of arrival of Tropical Storm Force Winds for Eastern North Carolina would be sometime tonight.
- However, the most likely time this area could see Tropical Storm Force Winds will be during the day on Monday.

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- The most likely time of arrival of Tropical Storm Force Winds for Eastern North Carolina is during the day on Monday.
- <u>However</u>, this area could see Tropical Storm Force Winds as early as sometime tonight.




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# Maximum Wind Gusts Through Monday

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
- Scattered power and communications outages.
- Greatest impacts expected along the immediate coast.





# Maximum Wind Gusts Through Monday

**Tropical Storm Arthur** 



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
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- Highest threat over the Outer Banks.
- Prepare for dangerous wind having possible significant impacts.
- Downed trees and widely scattered power outages possible.

There is a potential for:


- Localized inundation with storm surge flooding mainly along immediate shorelines and in low-lying spots.
- Moderate beach erosion. Heavy surf also breaching dunes, mainly in usually vulnerable locations.





## Flooding Rain Threat

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### Impacts


Periods of moderate to heavy rainfall are possible mainly along the coast, with the potential for localized minor flooding of low lying areas.




