

Marine	Dangerous rip currents, high surf and marine conditions dangerous to all mariners	Coastal waters and beaches	Through Monday
Wind	There is the potential for limited impacts	Along the coast and especially the Outer Banks	Through Monday
Storm Surge/ Inundation	There is the potential for limited impacts	Immediate shoreline and low-lying areas along or near the coast	Through Monday
Flooding Rain	Localized flooding of low-lying areas	Low-lying areas along or near the coast	Monday
Tornado	A few tornadoes are possible	Coastal counties	Through Monday

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


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- An enhanced risk for dangerous rip currents will continue through Monday.
- Tropical storm force winds will be possible along the coast and particularly the Outer Banks.
- Minor storm surge impacts will be possible for areas adjacent to the ocean, sounds, and rivers.


- Increased swell will produce very dangerous swimming conditions through early week.

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The threat for tropical storm force winds is increasing, especially along the Outer Banks.


 Tropical Storm conditions could begin as early as sometime tonight.

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


■ The threat for 50 knot winds is increasing, especially over the coastal waters.


- The earliest reasonable time of arrival of Tropical Storm Force Winds for Eastern North Carolina would be sometime tonight.
- However, the most likely time this area could see Tropical Storm Force Winds will be during the day on Monday.

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


- The most likely time of arrival of Tropical Storm Force Winds for Eastern North Carolina is during the day on Monday.
- However, this area could see Tropical Storm Force Winds as early as sometime tonight.


<u>Impacts</u>

- Scattered power and communications outages.
- Greatest impacts expected along the immediate coast.

Maximum Wind Gusts Through Monday

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


<u>Impacts</u>

- Highest threat over the Outer Banks.
- Prepare for dangerous wind having possible significant impacts.
- Downed trees and widely scattered power outages possible.

Oceanside Impacts

- Minor inundation from storm surge of up to 2 feet (above normally dry ground) in low-lying areas in the yellow shaded area.
- Moderate beach erosion. Heavy surf also breaching dunes, mainly in usually vulnerable locations.
- The water will rise fastest south of Cape Lookout mainly tonight into early Monday. The water will rise fastest north of Cape Lookout Monday and Monday night.


Sound Side Impacts

- Minor inundation from storm surge of up to 2 feet (above normally dry ground) in low-lying areas in the yellow shaded area.
- The water will rise fastest over the Lower Neuse River and Downeast Carteret County Monday morning.
- The water will rise fastest near
 Ocracoke and Hatteras Island mid
 Monday morning to Monday evening


Sound Side Impacts

- Minor inundation from storm surge of up to 2 feet (above normally dry ground) in low-lying areas in the yellow shaded area.
- The water will rise the fastest
 Monday afternoon and evening.

Flooding Rain Threat

Impacts

 Periods of moderate to heavy rainfall are possible mainly along the coast, with the potential for localized minor flooding of low lying areas.




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- ✓ Confidence is HIGH that the event will occur

Strong rip currents, high surf, and dangerous marine conditions expected at the beaches and across the coastal waters.




Strong wind gusts expected, especially along the coast and the Outer Banks.



Storm surge flooding is expected to have limited impacts across Eastern North Carolina.




Limited impacts are anticipated due to flooding rain across Eastern North Carolina.
