Flooding Rain	Significant impacts. Significant flash and urban flooding. Up to moderate river flooding.	Eastern North Carolina	Through today for flash and urban flooding. Through the weekend for river flooding.
Storm Surge & Inundation	Moderate impacts. Localized inundation, moderate beach erosion, ocean overwash.	Oceanside: the entire coast. Soundside: Outer Banks from Buxton through Ocracoke, Downeast Carteret, Neuse, Pamlico, and Pungo Rivers.	Peaking this afternoon through Friday.
Wind	Limited impacts. Scattered power outages.	Especially along the coast and Outer Banks.	Early this morning through Friday.



Tropical Storm Idalia



NOTE: Do not focus on the exact track.

<u>Impacts can occur well outside the area enclosed by the cone.</u>

 Tropical Storm Idalia will move near the North Carolina coastline early this morning.

 Impacts will continue into Friday, even as Idalia moves away from our area.

 This is a good reminder that impacts can occur well away from the center of the storm or forecast "cone".


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Inland Flooding Impacts

Tropical Storm Idalia




- Areas outlined in Red have the greatest potential for significant flash flooding through this afternoon.
- 2 to 4 inches of rain with isolated amounts up to 6 inches are still possible across the Outer Banks and eastern portions of the mainland.

 Driving conditions may become dangerous. Potential for road and bridge closures with some weakened or washed out. Extreme rainfall rates could result in urban and flash flooding which may prompt water rescues.



Potential Storm Surge Impacts

Moderate impact

(Yellow shaded areas):

Areas of inundation with moderate damage to marinas, docks.

Elevated impact


(Blue Shaded Areas):

Localized inundation, mainly along immediate shorelines and in low-lying spots.

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

Elevated impact

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
Ocean overwash, likely impacting NC-12, especially at periods of high tide (This evening/Friday Morning).

Moderate beach erosion.

There is a potential for:


Scattered power and communication outages.

 Highest potential will be in the Yellow Shaded area, closer to the coast.


 Highest wind speeds expected near the coast.

 Strongest winds are anticipated to continue through this evening.



Expected River Flooding

Tropical Storm Idalia



 Already elevated river levels in the NE Cape Fear basin as a result of heavy rainfall earlier this week.

 This will introduce a greater river flood potential as a result of heavy rainfall from Idalia.

 Forecast to crest at Moderate Flood Stage Sunday morning.



Tropical Storm Wind Speed Probabilities

Tropical Storm Idalia



• Tropical storm force winds are ongoing.

 The highest probability for tropical storm force winds remains near the coast and over the southern waters.

 Tropical storm conditions will continue through tonight.



50 kt (58 mph) Wind Speed Probabilities

Tropical Storm Idalia



 A few 50 kt gusts are possible today.



Confidence is **HIGH** that the event will occur Confidence is **HIGH** regarding impacts



Significant impacts from flash/urban flooding possible - 2" to 4" more inches of rain expected with isolated 6" amounts possible over the Outer Banks and eastern NC.

Minor to Moderate River flooding possible into the weekend.



Inundation of low-lying areas possible, especially for areas adjacent to the southern Pamlico Sound including the Neuse, Bay, Pamlico, and Pungo Rivers. Also along the Outer Banks.



Tropical storm force winds ongoing especially toward the coast and Outer Banks.



Dangerous marine conditions ongoing across the coastal waters.

Tornado threat has ended.
