

 Hurricane Idalia is forecast to make landfall in northwest FL this morning as a Major Hurricane.

 On the current track, impacts may be felt in our area as early as tonight.

 Idalia is forecast to approach Eastern North Carolina as a Tropical Storm Thursday with impacts lingering into Friday.






 Areas outlined in red have the greatest potential for significant flash flooding this afternoon through Thursday.

 An average of 3" to 8" of rain will be possible across Eastern NC, with isolated totals up to 10" possible.


 Significant urban and flash flooding is expected.







 Main threat of tornadoes will be from this afternoon through Thursday.


Enhanced areas of damage possible.

There is a potential for:


Scattered power and communication outages.

These winds are **highly dependent** on the storm's track and intensity. A small change could result in significant differences in wind speeds and impacts.


 Highest wind speeds expected near the coast.

 Strongest winds are anticipated Thursday through Thursday evening.

 The most likely time this area could see Tropical Storm Force Winds will be Thursday.

 The earliest reasonable time of arrival of Tropical Storm Force Winds for Eastern North Carolina is overnight tonight.


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Tropical Storm Wind Speed Probabilities

• The probability for tropical storm force winds is increasing.


 The highest probability for tropical storm force winds remains near the coast and over the southern waters.

 Highest threat remains south of Oregon Inlet.


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Rip Currents/Beach Erosion/Overwash

Confidence is **HIGH** that the event will occur Confidence is **HIGH** regarding impacts



Significant impacts from flash flooding possible - 3" to 8"+ of rain.



A few tornadoes are possible, which may produce enhanced areas of damage.



Inundation of low-lying areas possible, especially for areas adjacent to the southern Pamlico Sound including the Neuse, Bay, Pamlico, and Pungo Rivers.



Tropical storm force winds possible especially toward the coast and Outer Banks.



Dangerous marine conditions expected across the coastal waters.



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
