

Marine & Rip Currents	Large, dangerous seas and rip currents. Winds with gusts up to storm force.	Seas and Rip Currents: All coastal marine zones and area beaches. Storm Force Winds: Offshore waters from Surf City to Oregon Inlet. Gales: Waters north of Oregon Inlet, Pamlico/Croatan/Roanoke Sounds.	Starting Sunday and peaking Sunday evening.
Winds	Windy conditions could damage outdoor items, bring at least isolated power outages, and result in hazardous driving conditions for high-profile vehicles.	Greatest wind threat for Outer Banks and sites along the western Pamlico Sound.	Highest winds Sunday night.
Coastal Flooding	Coastal Flooding: Moderate to major inundation possible. 




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Maximum Wave Heights (ft)

Forecast Valid: Sunday through Monday






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Coastal Flooding Threat

Most Significant Flooding Potential in Orange

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
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Storm Total Rainfall (in.)

Event Summary

ONAL WEATHER SERVICE

 Confidence is HIGH that this event will occur, and we are expecting MODERATE to MAJOR impacts.



Very Dangerous Marine Conditions: Dangerous seas 15-20 ft with up to Storm Force winds Sunday through Monday. Dangerous surf conditions especially north of Cape Lookout.



Winds: Windy conditions could damage outdoor items, bring isolated power outages, and result in hazardous driving conditions for high-profile vehicles. Most vulnerable locations along the Outer Banks on Sunday night.



Coastal Flooding: Moderate to major soundside flooding possible on Sunday night along the Pamlico River and associated tributaries while lower water impacts the eastern Pamlico Sound. Behind the storm, moderate soundside flooding along the Outer Banks is possible.

Ocean Overwash: Large surf is expected for beaches from Duck to Cape Lookout, particularly late Sunday through Monday, leading to potential beach erosion and overwash in vulnerable areas.



Rainfall: 2 to 4 inches of rainfall across most of eastern NC. Slight risk of excessive rainfall.
